- (a) List FOUR other ways that secondary schools students could prepare themselves for work. **(4 marks)**
 - (b) State TWO desirable work attitudes which employers generally look for in employees. **(2 marks)**
 - (c) Three students want to apply for jobs in response to the advertisement in Figure 1.

- (i) Write THREE questions, **other than questions about salary**, that these students should ask when they call for further information about the vacancies. Give a reason for EACH question that you have written. **(6 marks)**
- (ii) State TWO qualifications that applicants should possess before responding to this application and give ONE reason for your answer. **(4 marks)**

- (b) State THREE guidelines for spending money wisely. **(3 marks)**
- (c) Jane wants to attend university. Her parents will pay her tuition fees but she has to take care of her needs, including medication for her chronic illness. She will also have to take a bus to campus every day.

- (b) List FOUR items that are necessary for stocking a home First Aid kit. **(4 marks)**
- (c) (i) Mrs Simpson cut her thumb while preparing dinner and no band-aids were available. Suggest THREE steps she should have taken as soon as the accident occurred. Give a reason for EACH step suggested. **(6 marks)**
- (ii) A father is caring for his son who is a toddler, at the same time that he is preparing the evening meal.
- Suggest TWO safety precautions that the father should take for protecting the child. **(4 marks)**

 - (iii) Children **(2 marks)**
- (b) Explain TWO ways in which migration of the father can affect the family. **(4 marks)**
- (c) Mr and Mrs Emson have five children whose ages are 4–17. Mr Emson is a builder while Mrs Emson is a supervisor in a hotel.
- (i) Suggest THREE possible effects of an economic downturn on the economic stability of this family. **(6 marks)**
 - (ii) Discuss TWO ways a community may provide support to this family and other families during a time of economic downturn. **(4 marks)**

- (i) Values
 - (ii) Goals
 - (iii) Needs **(6 marks)**
- (b) Joyce, a young typist, lives at home with her parents. She needs to decide if she should buy a car or pay for a course in computing that will increase her chances of getting a promotion at work. Joyce decides to pay for the course and postpone the car purchase for another year.
- (i) Outline TWO important steps that Joyce may have taken to arrive at the decision. **(4 marks)**
 - (ii) Explain how VALUES could have affected Joyce's decision in (b) (i) above. **(2 marks)**
 - (iii) Briefly discuss TWO personal qualities that Joyce should exhibit in order to achieve her goal. **(4 marks)**

6. (a) List FOUR points to support why a family would choose to buy rather than rent a house. **(4 marks)**
- (b) Name TWO institutions from which a family could obtain money to buy a house. **(2 marks)**
- (c) A family bought a five-year-old house which has a spacious living room that is used for several purposes. The room has large, wide, glass windows.
- (i) Suggest FOUR activities that the family could carry out in this living room. **(4 marks)**
 - (ii) Describe ONE way the family could use soft furnishings or furniture to make the family room appropriate for any THREE activities identified in (c) (i) above. **(6 marks)**
