- (i) Performs calculations within the CPU
 - (ii) Stores program instructions during the execution of the program
 - (iii) Implements the sequencing of instruction execution in the CPU
 - (iv) Reads data written in magnetic ink from a document
 - (v) Produces audio output from a computer
 - (vi) Captures graphical data directly from a document for input to a computer

- (f) State the number of flash drives that can be simultaneously connected to the computer. **(1 mark)**

- (g) Provide ONE piece of information which indicates that the computer is a laptop. (1 mark)
- (h) Name the type of operating system included with the computer system. (1 mark)
- (i) Name ONE general purpose software included with the computer system. (1 mark)

4. Applications can be classified as industrial, scientific, commercial, process control, and automation information processing systems.

- (a) For each application listed below, identify the class of information processing systems.
 - (i) Banking industry — managing user accounts
 - (ii) Weather forecasting — predicting the weather
 - (iii) Household appliance — sequencing wash cycle tasks in a washing machine
 - (iv) Manufacturing industry — using robots to assemble car components (4 marks)
- (b) For the past 30 years, the XY Company has been processing data using a computer system.
 - (i) In the earlier days, data were collected and stored on a data tape that only allowed the data to be stored one after the other. During processing, the data were accessed in the order in which they were entered. State the method of file organization implemented and the type of access used during processing. (2 marks)
 - (ii) In later years, data were stored by a device that allowed the data to be stored anywhere on the media. However, the data were still stored in the same way, that is, one after the other. A file structure was created that allowed the data to be accessed in any order. State the method of file organization implemented and the type of access used during processing. (2 marks)
 - (iii) Currently, the data are stored in files in which the records are ordered according to a key value. State the type of data access used during processing. (1 mark)
 - (iv) New devices are now installed that allow specific data to be captured directly from the input document. State the name for this type of input document. (1 mark)

- (c) State the difference between simplex and half-duplex data transmission. (2 marks)
- (d) Distinguish between an intranet and an extranet. (2 marks)
- (e) State ONE reason why an organization would choose to establish an extranet. (1 mark)
- (f) State ONE disadvantage of an extranet. (1 mark)

6. The local government office in your district collects government revenue from residents in the district, and organizes and administers the maintenance of government offices and roads. A small office staff is employed to perform the administrative functions required by the office. This staff utilizes a local area network to assist in the performance of their functions.
- (a) State ONE method that is used to prevent members of the public from having physical access to the computers. (1 mark)
- (b) State ONE software method that can be used to prevent unauthorized staff from accessing sensitive data on the network. (1 mark)
- (c) State FOUR ways that the integrity of the data can be destroyed. (4 marks)
- (d) State TWO steps in a procedure that can be used to restore online data that is lost. (2 marks)
- (e) Data on hours worked by employees are entered by the clerical staff. Outline ONE method used to verify the accuracy of the data entered. (2 marks)

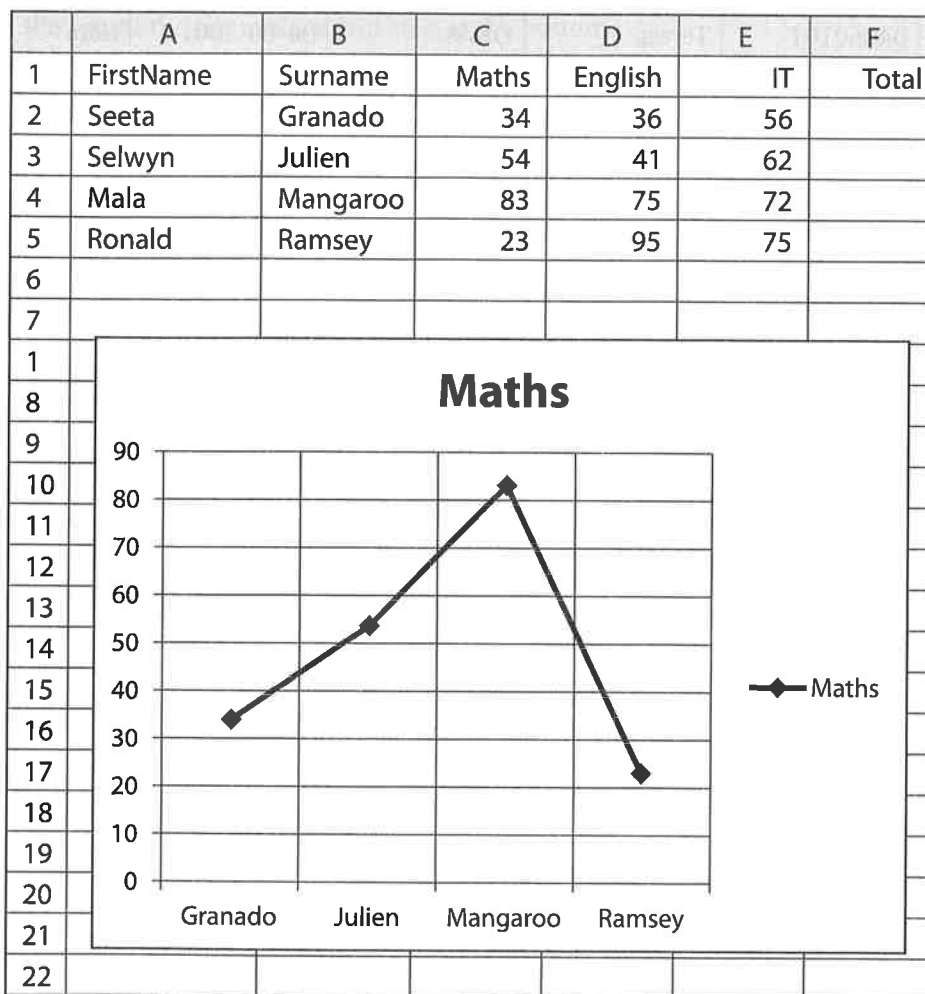
